1. Goats must be owned by May 10, 2009 and born after November 1, 2008.
 2. Market Goat weigh-in May 16th, 2009 at Howard County Vet. Services. All market goats must weigh-in. If you are unable to make this date, then exhibitor must make prior arrangements to have market animal (s) weighed between May 9-23, 2009.
 3. All goats must be pre-registered and exhibitor must have signed expectation letter. Registration Forms must be returned to the Howard County Extension Center by June 1, 2008. Forms are available at the end of the livestock section of the fair book.
 4. All exhibitors must be **Show Me Quality Assurance Certified**.
 5. All exhibits must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health Certificate) to be eligible to show. This health certificate must have been written within 30 days of exhibition. All goats must also be identified either by ear tag, electronic implant or tattoo.
 6. Exhibitors help is appreciated in setting up the barn. Set-up on Monday, July 6, 2009.
 7. **All exhibits must be in place by 12:00 p.m. Thursday, July 9, 2009. Livestock can begin arriving at the show barn no earlier than 5:00 pm. July 8, 2008.**
 8. Exhibitor must groom and care for their animal.
 9. Market goats may be of any meat breed or crossbred. Castrated males (wethers) or females may be shown in the market classes. No bucks allowed. If a nanny is shown in market class, it cannot be shown in breeding stock class.
 10. An individual may show two market goats but only one will be allowed to be listed in the Howard County Fair Premium Sale. The heaviest qualifying market animal will be the individual chosen to be listed in the premium sale unless the show clerk is notified immediately after the show.
 11. Minimum weight for market goats to be listed in the Howard County Fair Premium Sale is 45 lbs.
 12. Eligibility of miniature goat breeds will be determined by a special committee made up of members of the Howard County Livestock Committee.
 13. **Upon completion of the Howard County Premium Sale the exhibitor will maintain ownership of their goat. If a sale bidder (s) are interested in purchasing a market goat then that transaction will be solely be between the exhibitor and the potential buyer. The Howard County Fair will in no way be apart of this transaction.**
